From routine check-ups to lifesaving treatments, we help keep pets healthy and in loving homes by offering a comprehensive range of veterinary services and pet retention programs.



CELIA Alana found Celia as a tiny kitten on the side of the road and thought she was rescuing her. Little did she know that Celia would rescue her family.

Alana's daughter is autistic and does not usually communicate. With Celia, her daughter immediately began talking and coming out of her shell. Now Celia has been with her family for almost two years and brings comfort and love to the entire family. Since the day she arrived, they have spoiled her and given her everything she needed. Recently Alana fell on some hard times and Celia fell sick. Alana didn't know where to turn. Luckily, she could turn to First

Coast No More Homeless Pets for the critical care that Celia needed. Thanks to our incredible donor base, Celia's treatment was within her mom's budget, and our team was able to give her the care she needed to feel like herself again!

Now Celia is back at home with her parents and Alana's daughter, giving them all the comfort and love they need. Alana says, "Because of this clinic, I no longer have to worry about losing my daughter's best friend."



LUNA Shaka first got Luna after losing another member of his fur family three years ago. Shaka had suffered a Traumatic Brain Injury and Luna understood that he needed her. Luna follows Shaka's side to try and keep him smiling and make certain he is safe.

Shaka states, "She nurtures me when I cry and get into depression." She has a fur brother that teaches her about Shaka's seizures. Luna wants to be the first to protect and nourish Shaka. When Luna suffered a broken leg, Shaka did not know what to do or where to go, he found First Coast No

More Homeless Pets. We were able to provide the orthopedic care that Luna needed so she could continue to love and nurture Shaka.

Shaka professes, "She keeps the big place that went missing when my other dog passed. I got Luna a year after my accident. She has been a big reminder that I am still loved and not forgotten." Shaka can not have children following his accident so his fur babies are his kids.
